While most eat insects, some consume larger animals like mice, frogs, and geckos.


The Venus flytrap has a jaw-shaped leaf with bristles. It looks like a big mouth with teeth!

Pitcher plants are sneaky about rapping their food. Attracted to the plant's nectar scent, insects climb into the long neck. Tiny, downward-facing

Bugs head deeper into the plant until eventually they're digested.
